Types of Internships

- Analysis/research (collecting data, preparing analytical/research papers)
- Journalism (writing and editing articles and social media posts)
- **Communications/public relations** (reaching the media, developing partnerships, coordinating events, finding grant opportunities)
- **IT/Design** (maintain websites, creating infographics)
- o Translation (translating texts from English to Ukrainian/Russian and from Ukrainian/Russian to English)

Eligibility

Ukrainian and foreign students and recent graduates of all backgrounds having a good command of Ukrainian/Russian and English are eligible to apply.

Application

To be considered, please submit the following to Iuliia Shybalkina (ishybalkina@case-ukraine.kiev.ua):

- CV
- Short essay on what you would like to do during your internship
- **One work sample** such as a paper, an article, an infographic, a translation, etc. (it should be related to the type of internship you are applying for)

Each intern will be assigned to a mentor and provided with a letter of recommendation upon successful completion of the internship. Internships are unpaid. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis. Typically, internships are for the period of three months. Internships can be full-time or part-time.
